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What is a PDF File?



PDF stands for the Adobe Portable Document Format

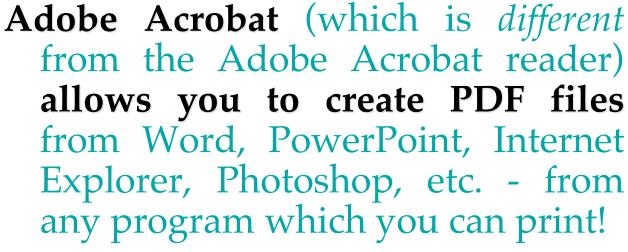
PDF files maintain the author's intended look - identical layout, fonts, links, images, etc. - regardless of viewing hardware and software (Windows, Mac, Linux, Palm, etc.)

Viewing PDF files is free using Adobe Acrobat reader (and in browsers)

Lots of security features available (digital signatures), accessibility OK (Version 5), excellent compatibility with previous versions



What is Adobe Acrobat?



Easy to create PDF files, can spruce up PDFs if required (links, accessibility, etc.)

Can incorporate multimedia, email and Web links, much more

Can allow for paperless offices



How to Create PDFs at MHCC

MHCC Library: Library will create class handout PDF files for free, usually less than 24 hours turn around time

Adobe Website Online: about \$9.99/month (http://createpdf.adobe.com)

Online Education Reseller: about \$60 for Adobe Acrobat (http://www.journeyed.com)

Buy From Adobe: about \$250 for Adobe *Acrobat (http://www.adobe.com/store)*

Why Create PDFs?

- Create webpage documents without HTML - Syllabus, PowerPoint notes, quiz answers, lab manuals, etc.
- Store entire websites for offline viewing
- Publish brochures for programs, events
- Produce slideshows with pictures, multimedia for poster sessions, etc.
- Paperless grading when combined with an electronic tablet

Therapies Provided for Communication Disorders

Articulation Disorders: Difficulties with the way sounds are formed and put together usually characterized by substituting one sound for another (tar for car), omitting a sound (poon for spoon), or distorting a sound (yeth for yes).

Oral Facial Myofunctional Disorders (OMD): An abnormal swallow pattern, commonly referred to as tangua thrust. OMD therapy focuses on the

Therapies Provided (continued)

Oral-motor Weakness/Abnormal Sensitivities: Poor tongue, lip or jaw muscle tone and strength can lead to speech and/or feeding difficulties. Some children experience sensory issues related to their speech disorder. These children may be hypersensitive (overly sensitive to oral stimuli such as specific tastes, textures) or hyposensitive (an underreaction to oral stimulus – these children crave extra stimuli such as spicy or crunchy foods, or stuff food into their mouths for the needed stimulus). Therapy focuses on normalizing oral sensitivities as well as improving muscle tone and function.

Stuttering in Preschool Age: An interruption in the rhythm of speech characterized by hesitations, repetitions or prolongations of sounds syllables words

PDF Examples: Creating Classroom Documents

Creating PDF files is similar to printing a document, and a variety of document types can be converted to PDFs (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Photoshop, etc.)

PDF files can be made quite secure, preventing copyright "transgressions" if desired.

PDF Examples: Archiving Websites

Adobe Acrobat does more than simply create PDF files. For example, it allows you to store entire websites for offline browsing.

Archived website PDF files can be quite large, but they make nice reading material for non-wireless airplane trips!

PDF Examples: Brochures

Adobe Acrobat allows for the creation of multimedia-rich brochures which can be linked to internet sites for additional options.

Acrobat incorporates JavaScript and other tools for possible rollover buttons, interactive form data, and much more.

PDF Examples: Slideshows

Adobe Acrobat can incorporate a variety of file formats to create stunning PDF files.

One application is to make a slideshow of digital pictures, possibly to be used at a poster session, promotional trade show, etc.

PDF Examples: Paperless Grading

Grading electronic papers has been hampered by the lack of a "pen" for scribbling notes, encouragement, mistakes, etc.

PDF files in Adobe Acrobat have ample reviewing possibilities, and if an electronic tablet is used, handwritten notes may be included on top of the "base" document.
